Measure M & N Budget

Transfer \$300,000 from Athletic Facilities to Technology in order to fund the one-to-one technology initiative. Transfer would leave a \$100,000 shortfall in the Technology budget. As per agreement with local developer, a significant donation will be made in the near future to the Guadalupe Kids Come First Foundation for the use of technology. The \$100,000 deficit would be funded by this donation from the Kids Come First Foundation.

Superintendent, Mr. Cora was given direction to prepare and send a survey asking families how they feel about bond measure funds being used for technology. Mr. Cora and Mrs. Lopez will work on drafting the survey Upon return of the surveys, Mr. Cora will send the results to the board prior to the next board meeting.
