A motion was made by Mrs. Cepeda, seconded by Mr. Pereyra and carried to reduce budgeted amount of \$500,000 under Measure N for Technology to \$100,000 and increase funding under Measure N for athletic facilities by \$400,000, provided the amount can be amended at a later date.
